

Introduction

- In the outer courtyard of the Tabernacle there were 2 pieces of sacred furniture.
- · Firstly the 'Brazen Altar' and then the 'Laver.'

1 The PLAN Of The Laver

- The Laver was directly between the Brazen Altar and the entrance into the 'Holy Place.'
- · No specific measurements given regarding it.
- Made of 'burnished' bronze (mirrors) allowing the priest to see himself in it.
- Probably like a large cup and saucer without the handle.
- The upper part (Laver) and lower part (Basin).

2 The POINT Of The Laver

- The word 'Laver' comes from the word 'lave' meaning 'to wash/bathe.'
- The priest had to wash in this before he performed his duties.
- God regarded the cleanliness of the priests as something important.

3 The Laver Is A PICTURE

- The 'Brazen Altar' is a picture of Christ's sacrifice at Calvary for our sins.
- It is a picture of our 'blood bought SALVATION.'

- The Laver is a picture of our 'SANCTIFICATION.'
- (Some has suggested the Laver is a picture of water baptism).

4 The Doctrine Of SANCTIFICATION

- From 'sanctus' meaning 'holy' and 'facere' meaning 'to make,'
- Sanctification means 'to make holy.'
- Consider: [Leviticus 19:2], [1Peter 1:16], [1Thessalonians 4:3].
- Our 'justification' is a one time act God does but our sanctification is an on-going process.
- In this process we co-operate with the Holy Spirit to be free from pollution of sin and become Christ like.
- Salvation and sanctification are 2 separate things but they should never be separated because you cannot have one without the other.

5 Why Sanctification?

- A converted person has 2 natures.
- New nature inclined towards holiness and pleasing God & an old nature which although now weakened is still there.
- · Our sanctification is about keeping down any 'residual sin.'

6 The Laver Is The Word Of God

- Consider [James 1:23], [John 15:3], [John 17:17], [Psalm 119:9], [Ephesians 5:25 - 26].
- We come to the Laver (Word of God) each day and we see ourselves and our shortcomings.
- In our salvation it is Christ on the cross and in our sanctification it is us on the cross. (I die daily)
- We are cleansed by the Word impacting us.
- Advice: Examine yourself each day and plan for improvement.
- · Aim to be holy.
- Our sanctification ends when Jesus comes or calls and then the final stage of the process occurs our glorification.
