PART 26: WHY SPEAK IN TONGUES? (PART 1)

Reading: Acts 2: 1 - 13

Introduction

- We are now considering the three gifts of 'inspiration'.
- The 1st of those gifts is 'different kinds of tongues.'
- Sometimes referred too as the 'glossolalia'.
- From Greek words 'glossa' (tongue) and 'lalia' (talking).
- Speaking in tongues is hinted at in OT. [Isaiah 28:11].
- Jesus also spoke of it before His ascension. [Mark 16:17].

1 The Day Of Pentecost

- The initial outpouring of the Holy Spirit with the accompanying glossolalia was in [Acts 2].
- Many people heard the gift and it generated 3 different reactions to it.

2 The Reactions To The Glossolalia

- The Reaction of AMAZEMENT. [vs 7].
- The Reaction of CONFUSION. [vs 6 & 12].
- The Reaction of CRITICISM & CYNICISM. [vs 13].
- These 3 reactions still occur today.
- Pentecostals have been persecuted by other Christians because of this experience.
- Some Pentecostals regard themselves as superior to non-Pentecostals.
- As we deal with this subject may we have 'the Berean spirit'.

3 The Vocal Miracle

- The Glossolalia in the NT was the initial evidence of one having been baptised in the Spirit.
- At Jerusalem. [Acts 2:4].
- At Caesarea. [Acts 10:44].
- At Ephesus. [Acts 19:6].
- The experience was not 'gibberish' or 'gobbly-gook'.

Definition

- Supernatural manifestation whereby the Holy Spirit uses the speech organs of a person enabling them to speak or sing in a language they'd never learned and at the time of speaking is not even understood by them.
- Harold Horton in his book, 'the gifts of the Spirit' describes it as 'the vocal miracle.'
- Paul encourages and indeed wished all believers to speak in tongues. [1 Corinthians 14:5].
