

Reading: 1 Samuel 23:14 - 18

Introduction

- These chapters record David on the run from his jealously insane father-inlaw, king Saul.
- He's had to exchange the palace for the wilderness and swop comfort for caves and forests.
- This part of David's life would last for some 10 years.
- But in the wilderness of Ziph, God was putting iron in his soul.
- David had to constantly be on the move as Saul's relentless search for him continued unabated.

1 'But God'

- David was not in a nice place but the words 'but God' changes the whole thing.
- Our circumstances do not get to be the last word. 'But God'.
- Notice the other places this wonderful truth turns up: [Acts 7:9], [Genesis 50:20], [Genesis 8:1], [Psalm 49:14/15], [Acts 13:29/30], [1 Corinthians 10:13], [Ephesians 2:1 - 4].
- "But God did not deliver him...." Jehovah, not Saul, was the master of the situation.

2 An Unexpected Visitor

- God knows when we need encouragement.
- Jonathan walks unto the biblical stage again.
- Jonathan had better 'intel' than his wicked father.
- · He stole away to surprise David.
- Jonathan "strengthened his hands in God."
- The margin renders it, 'Jonathan encouraged him in God.'
- Encouragement: the act of giving someone confidence/support.
- There's a David near you right now. Can you be a Jonathan to them?
- Consider [Hebrews 3:13], [Hebrews 10:25], [1 Thess 5:11].
 - NB. Exhort/edify mean 'encourage.'

3 Closing Scene [Vs 18]

- · Their departing must had been hard.
- · Jonathan should have stayed with David.
- · They would never meet again.
- Go and strengthen someone's hand in God.....while you can.
