[PART 5] OLIVET'S PROPHECIES -FULFILLED OR FUTURE (2)

Exposition Of Matthew 24: 15 - 20

Introduction

- [Matthew 24] and the parallel accounts in [Mark 13] & [Luke 21] record Christ's 'Olivet Discourse.'
- In it, Jesus answers His disciples 2 questions prompted by His announcement that the temple is going to be destroyed.
- In the discourse, Jesus talks about the end of 2 things: the temple and then His return and the end of the age.
- **Question**: Are those 2 events fulfilled or future? Jesus begins to answer their 1st question re: the end of the temple.

Read [Vs 15]

- This is the answer to their 1st question.
- What does Jesus mean by 'the abomination of desolation?'
- Is He referring to a still future to emerge antichrist who will sit in the holy of holies in some new future rebuilt temple in Jerusalem?
- Although that idea is very popular it is a wrong and flawed idea.
- **Consider:** the disciples were asking about the temple in their day. Not some other temple.
- If it was some other future temple Jesus was referring too then He didn't answer their 1st question.
- This verse is still not awaiting its fulfilment it was fulfilled in AD70.
- The parallel account in [Luke 21:20] tells us what the 'abomination of desolation' is.
- It is Jerusalem (the holy place) surrounded by armies. (The Roman armies).
- He wanted His 'elect' at that time to be safe and to escape the desolation.

Read [vs 16]

• So he warns them to flee to the mountains when they would see Jerusalem being surrounded.

Read [vs 17/18]

• There would not even be time to go home and pack for the trip.

Read [vs 19/20]

• Speed would be essential. Being pregnant would slow their escape. Winter could make the escape difficult too.

The Events Of AD70

- The Jews were rebelling against their Roman masters.
- Governor Cestius Gallus marched the Roman armies towards Jerusalem.
- Jews and Christians alike swarmed into the city for safety.
- How were the Christians going to escape with the city surrounded?
- Josephus: 'without any reason in the world' Cestius withdrew his armies and the Jews celebrated.
- The emperor was furious and replaced him with Vespasian who had his son Titus bring up the 5th/10th legions from Egypt.
- In the meantime the Christians remembering Jesus words fled for safety.
- Bible prophecy saved their lives.
- Adam Clark: 'not a single Christian perished in the destruction of Jerusalem.'
- The Romans returned and surrounded the city.
- Upon breaking through the walls they slaughtered 1,100,000 Jews and took 1000's more away as slaves.
- The temple was burned with fire and the gold melted and ran into the crevices between the great stone building blocks.
- Later, when it solidified, the soldiers literally pulled the stones apart to retrieve the gold thus fulfilling Jesus words 40 years earlier.

The Accuracy Of Jesus

- Everything Jesus said from that day in [Matthew 24] up until the Roman armies came against Jerusalem, history confirms.
- How Jesus said the temple would be made desolate, again history confirms.
- Jesus answered their 1st question and what He said happed.
- In the next verses He will answer their 2nd question and we have every reason to believe what He said about that will also happen.
- Just as the elect were safe at the end of the temple they will be safe at the end of age.
