

Reading: **Matthew 24:30 - 35**

Introduction

- Matthew 24 is the 'backbone' of that body of teaching called 'Bible Prophecy.'
- In the discourse, Jesus deals with the end of the Jerusalem temple and the end of this age associated with His Second Coming.
- The prophecy re: the end of the temple has been fulfilled but **NOT** the prophecy re: His Second Coming.
- [24: 30/31] Jesus speaks briefly with re: to the nature of His return.

1 The Parable Of The Fig Tree

- Does Jesus give us a clue/hint as to when His return will be?
- Notice his horticultural parable [vs 32].
- Jesus uses the 'fig tree' to represent the nation of the Jews. [Jeremiah 24].

2 The Miracle Of The Fig Tree

- In [Matthew 21:18 19] Jesus curses the fig tree because it was fruitless and it died.
- The Messiah had come and the Jews had rejected Him.
- The Jewish nation was just leaves (all show) no fruit (salvation or righteousness).
- In AD70 the national fig tree of the Jews died and the Jews became homeless and scattered.

3 The Fig Tree Would Again Show Signs Of Life

- The fig tree would 'put forth leaves.'
- After centuries of being homeless and Gentiles squatting in their national home,
 Jerusalem was liberated in December 1917.
- The Balfour Declaration paved the way for the Jews to begin to return.
- In May 1948 the Jewish national council in Tel Aviv proclaimed the re-establishment of a Jewish state to be called 'Israel.'
- After centuries of being dead the 'fig tree' again budded.
- They have fought and indeed are fighting wars for their continued existence.
- There are those who want to chop the fig tree down.
- The 're-budding' fig tree is a sign the return of Jesus is near.
- NB. 'Put forth leaves.' Again just leaves, no fruit.

4 The Fig Tree Generation

• [Vs 34] The generation that witnessed the budding of the fig tree in 1948 will not have passed away before Jesus returns.

5 The Kingdom Of God Is Near

- [Vs 33]. What is meant by 'IT?'
- Consider [Mark 13:29] and [Luke 21:31]. Luke tells us 'IT' is the Kingdom of God.
- The word 'kingdom' is translated from Greek word 'basileia' meaning 'the reign or the rule of God.'
- The Kingdom of God is in us in seed form when we so organise our lives that His will is done.
- It is amongst a group of people (i.e. church) when they so arrange their lives and they can enjoy the benefits of the kingdom now.
- The kingdom will come in its fullest sense when Jesus returns.
